STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-Eight of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen, Revised Statutes of Nineteen Hundred Sixteen, Relating to Compensation of Judge of Probate of County of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-eight, chapter one hundred seventeen of the
2 revised statutes of nineteen hundred sixteen is amended by
3 striking out, after the word York, in the twentieth line there-

4 of, the words, "thirteen hundred" and inserting in the place

5 thereof, the words 'one thousand six hundred,' so that the

6 same as amended shall read:

'Sect. 38. Judges of probate in the several counties shall 2 receive annual salaries from the treasurers of the counties in 3 quarterly payments on the first days of January, April, July 4 and October as follows: Androscoggin, one thousand dol-5 lars; Aroostook, twelve hundred dollars; Cumberland, three 6 thousand dollars; Franklin, six hundred dollars; Hancock, 7 eleven hundred dollars; Kennebec, seventeen hundred dol-8 lars; Knox, seven hundred dollars; Lincoln, five hundred o dollars; Oxford, one thousand dollars; Penobscot, eighteen 10 hundred dollars; Piscataquis, six hundred dollars; Sagada-11 hoc, eight hundred dollars; Somerset, eight hundred dollars; 12 Waldo, seven hundred dollars; Washington, eight hundred 13 dollars; York, one thousand six hundred dollars; and the 14 fees to which they are entitled by law, except the fee pro-15 vided in section forty-nine of chapter one hundred and forty-16 five, shall be taxed and collected and paid over by the regis-17 ters of probate to the county treasurers for the use of their 18 counties.'
