STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 101 of the Private and Special Laws
of 1911 relating to the Phillips Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter 101 of the Private and Special Laws of 1911 relat-
ing to the Phillips Village Corporation is hereby repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In 1911 a petition was sent to the Legislature signed by about a dozen members of Phillips Village Corporation, acting without any authority from the Corporation, asking for the passage of Chapter 101 as an amendment to the Corporation Charter.

Only a few members knew of the proposed project and probably only those who signed the petition.

In June, 1915, the contract for lighting the streets of the Corporation expired. The members of the Corporation then were confronted with the fact that by reason of the amendment no contract could be made for lights until the annual meeting in 1916. Therefore the Corporation was without street lights for the remainder of the summer and quite a part of the fall.

The inconvenience was so great after the nights became long that the Assessors were compelled to make a temporary arrangement for lights until the annual meeting of 1916.

At said annual meeting it was voted without opposition to instruct the Assessors to take necessary measures to have Chapter 101 repealed as shown by a copy of the record hereunto attached.

'Art. 12. On motion duly made and seconded it was voted as follows:

"That the assessors of Phillips Village Corporation be authorized and instructed in behalf of said Corporation to take any and all necessary measures to prosecute and effect a repeal by the next Legislature of Chapter 101 of the Private and Special Laws of 1911, entitled "An Act to amend certain Acts relating to the Phillips Village Corporation." "

I hereby certify that the above is a true copy of so much of the record of the 1916 annual meeting of Phillips Village Corporation as relates to the repeal of said Chapter 101.
