STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE. HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 76 of Chapter 4, of the Revised Statutes, 1916, relating to any town raising money to secure free use of library in adjoining town.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 76 of Chapter 4 is hereby amended by striking out
the words "equal to" in the sixth line and inserting in place
thereof, the words 'not less than seven per cent nor more
than,' and inserting after the word "yearly" in the seventh
line 'provided that no town shall receive annually more than
five hundred dollars,' so that the section as amended shall
read as follows:

'Any town may raise and appropriate annually a sum of 2 money, not exceeding the legal limit established for main-3 taining free libraries, for the purpose of securing to its in-4 habitants the free use of a library located in an adjoining 5 town, and shall be entitled to receive from the treasurer of 6 state a sum not less than seven per cent nor more than ten 7 per cent of the amount so raised, appropriated and expended 8 yearly, provided that no town shall receive annually more 9 than five hundred dollars, to be paid on the certificate of its 10 municipal officers returned as provided in section seventy-11 eight.'
