AN ACT to regulate the sale of milk in bottles or jars, within  
the Town of Eden, Hancock County.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. No person, either by himself, clerk, servant,  
2 or agent, shall sell, or offer for sale, any milk or cream, in  
3 bottles or jars, within the Town of Eden, Hancock County,  
4 Maine, unless the name or initials of such person, or those  
5 of his principal, are blown in the bottle or jar, containing  
6 the milk or cream so sold or offered.

Sect. 2. Whoever, as principal or as clerk, servant, or  
2 agent, violates the provisions of the first section hereof

3 shall forfeit the sum of ten dollars for each offence, to be  
4 recovered by complaint.
