STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

An Act to amend Chapter Seventy-six of the Revised Statutes of Nineteen Hundred and Sixteen, relating to Sales of Real Estate by License of Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph four of section one of chapter seventy-six of the 2 revised statutes of nineteen hundred and sixteen is hereby 3 amended by adding the following sentence: 'For the pur-4 poses of this section an insane husband or wife who has 5 been committed to an asylum for insane persons, within the 6 state of Maine, shall be deemed to remain a resident of the

7 county in which he or she had a residence at the time he or

8 she was committed, so long as he or she shall remain in such 9 an asylum by virtue of such commitment,' so that said para-10 graph as amended shall read as follows:

'IV. Of a husband or guardian of an incapacitated wife 2 resident in the county, to sell, on such terms and conditions 3 as the judge thinks proper, for a sufficient consideration, 4 any real estate held by him in right of his wife, or any of 5 her right and interest by descent in any real estate owned by 6 him; and of the guardian of an incapacitated husband, 7 resident in the county, to sell in like manner, the right and 8 interest by descent, of such ward, in any real estate owned 9 by his wife. For the purposes of this section an insane 10 husband or wife who has been committed to an asylum for 11 insane persons, within the state of Maine, shall be deemed 12 to remain a resident of the county in which he or she had 13 a residence at the time he or she was committed, so long as 14 he or she shall remain in such an asylum by virtue of such 15 commitment.'
