STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to prohibit the carrying of dangerous or deadly weapons without a license.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall in a threatening manner dis-2 play any firearm, slung-shot, knuckles, bowie knife, dirk, 3 stiletto or other dangerous or deadly weapon, nor shall wear 4 under his clothes or concealed about his person any such 5 firearm, slung-shot, knuckles, bowie knife, dirk, stiletto or 6 other dangerous or deadly weapon unless first licensed so 7 to do in the following manner.

Sect. 2. The chief of police or city marshal, or in his ab-2 sence, either of his captains of police of any city or the se-3 lectmen of any town, may upon written application issue 4 to any person of good moral character whose business or 5 occupation requires the carrying of such weapons for pro-6 tection, a certificate setting forth that such person has com-7 plied with the requirements of this law and that he has been 8 duly licensed to carry such weapon or weapons for protec-9 tion. Said license shall continue in effect until revoked by 10 the chief of police or by the selectmen of the town in which 11 said license was issued.

Sect. 3. Nothing in the foreging section shall be construed 2 as prohibiting the carrying or wearing of such weapons by 3 United States marshals, sheriffs and their deputies, consta-4 bles and police officers and other officers duly commissioned 5 by the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Sect. 4. Whoever violates the provisions of this law shall 2 be fined not less than one hundred dollars or confined in 3 the county jail for a period not exceeding ninety days.
