*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled:*

In accordance with the provisions of Section 90 of the Revised Statutes, the Auditor herewith submits to the Legislature a full and accurate statement of the financial condition of the State and of the financial transactions thereof for the two years ending with the thirty-first of December, 1916.

The cash in the State Treasury has increased from \$778,045.69 to \$1,473,118.05, an increase for two years of \$695,072.36.

There has been no temporary loan made during the past two years.

Upon assuming the duties of this office, I found that several institutions were accustomed to expend their revenue to meet their current bills without any legal warrant. Thereupon, I notified the heads of the several departments and institutions that it was incumbent upon them to deposit, on the first day of each month, with the State Treasurer all moneys received by them during that period,—thus enabling the Auditor to audit all bills and the payment of same made by the State Treasurer through the proper channels as the law contemplates.

The heads of all departments and all persons having claims against the State were notified to present same for payment in December and every effort was made to pay all bills *prior* to 1917.

Many changes in the accounting system have been made during my term of office. A separation was made of the various funds of the State—as set forth in the accompanying statements, showing the General, Highway, Permanent, and Sinking Funds, *separately*, which heretofore were classified together, whether active or inactive accounts. Overhead Ledgers have been started which deal with “Controlling Accounts” for various functions of the State as a whole and which will produce accurate exhibits of the financial condition of the State at any date hereafter.

A requisition system was inaugurated July 1, 1915, requiring that all purchases made by the State be approved by the head of the Department making same and then submitted to this office for approval. This system enables the Auditor to ascertain at any time what bills are outstanding against the State. These changes and improvements were brought about by the hearty co-operation of the proficient clerks in the department,—all working as a unit.

The thorough audit of the Automobile Registration Accounts by Michael R. Burns of this office is worthy of commendation.

I would recommend that the business of the Automobile Registration be transferred from the Office of Secretary of State to the State Highway Department as is the custom in many other states.

The system in vogue in the Secretary of State's Office for the payment of Department stationery and supplies was abolished. A new system was introduced whereby the bills could be audited by this Department and be paid by the State Treasurer upon order of the Governor and Council.

The work in the State Auditor's Office is rapidly increasing. I found it impossible to give any of the Institutions a real exhaustive audit. I most heartily recommend the appointment of a Traveling Auditor to audit the Institutions and Departments, frequently; in addition to this work, to investigate the State Pauper Claims, and claims for damages to domestic animals by dogs or wild animals. I believe that thousands of dollars could be saved the State by investigating these claims.

The Traveling Auditor should be moved as far as possible from political or partisan influences and his appointment should be based solely on efficiency and good character in office; he should be adequately paid so that highly trained men might be obtained for the service of the State.

The Auditor's Office is one of great responsibility and I would recommend that his salary be increased from \$2,500 to \$3,500.

I would recommend that an appropriation be made for Postage,—same to be handled by the Treasurer's Office. Department heads, when requiring postage, should make requisition to the Treasurer of State for same.

An investigation of the Passamaquoddy Indian Fund and the Permanent School Fund should be made.

The principal of the fund termed "Lands Reserved for Public Uses" has been thoroughly investigated, as authorized; and we have entered it at its true standing on the records of this office. I have carried this fund as a current asset since the law prescribes that the aforesaid fund shall remain in the State Treasury. If this is not to be considered the true status of the Fund as outlined above,—then it would be fitting for the Legislature to amend the law and thus terminate all controversy over the question.

I would again recommend, as I have already done in my report on "Estimates and Expenditures" submitted to your honorable body, that

the law requiring that all estimates be filed not later than the first Monday of December be amended so as to read "not later than November first"—as it is impossible to give these estimates the proper attention in so short a time
