## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

JOINT RESOLVE for the creation of a commission to investigate the entire question of ownership and development by the State of the undeveloped water powers within the State and all issues necessarily involved therein.

Resolved: That a commission of five members, one of 2 whom shall be an engineer skilled in his profession, shall 3 be appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Coun-4 cil, whose duty it shall be to make a thorough and impartial 5 investigation of the entire subject of ownership and develop-6 ment by the State of the undeveloped water powers within 7 the State and all issues necessarily involved therein.

That it, among other things, shall investigate and report 2 what water powers have been developed by private com-3 panies, the character and extent thereof and to what extent, 4 if any, said companies by combinations or otherwise have 5 attempted to retard or have retarded the development of 6 water powers for the purpose of preventing competition.

That it shall, so far as is practicable, investigate and re-2 port the number and capacity of the undeveloped water pow-3 ers, the estimated cost of acquiring and developing the same 4 and the best methods for such development.

That it shall investigate and report as to the rights of the 2 people in and to the undeveloped water powers.

That it shall investigate and report upon the practicability 2 and cost of the use of electricity for heating purposes and 3 the relative value of coal and electricity for such purposes. 4 Also the practicability and cost of distributing electricity 5 through the farming sections of the State for heating, light-6 ing and power purposes.

Said commission shall hold public meetings from time to 2 time in different sections of the State, of which due public 3 notice shall be given, so that all interested parties may be 4 given full opportunity to be heard.

It shall investigate and report on such other matters per-2 taining to this subject as it may deem necessary and proper. Said commission is authorized and empowered to employ

2 such assistance as it may deem necessary, and shall have the 3 power to summon and compel the attendance of witnesses

- 4 who shall testify under oath and to compel the production
- 5 of books and documents and such other papers as it may
- 6 deem necessary for the proper performance of its duties.

Said commission shall on or before December 1, 1920, make

- 2 a full report to the Governor and Council of its findings, to-
- 3 gether with recommendations for such legislation, if any, as
- 4 it may deem necessary.

The members of the commission shall recieve such com-2 pensation as may be determined by the Governor and Coun-3 cil.

That there is hereby appropriated for the year 1919 the

- 2 sum of twenty-five thousand dollars and for the year 1920
- 3 the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars.
