STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE to reimburse the city of Biddeford for money paid to soldiers' and sailors' dependents.

Resolved: That there be paid to the city of Biddeford 2 the sum of five hundred and fifty-six dollars and seventy 3 cents to reimburse said city for money paid to soldiers' de-4 pendents in the year nineteen hundred seventeen.

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STATEMENT OF FACTS

In the year of nineteen hundred and seventeen the city of Biddeford paid to the following named persons, who were proved to be dependents of soldiers, the amount of money opposite their respective names:

The money was paid by the city to these dependents figuring from the time of induction of the soldiers into the service. By ruling of the Governor and Council it was decided that the time began at the application of the dependent, rather than from the time of the induction of soldiers. The city had already paid out these amounts and there was no law by which the city could be reimbursed except by special act of the Legislature. Upon recommendation of a member of the Governor's Council, this resolve is presented to the Legislature to reimburse the city for the money spent as above stated.
