STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT relative to the tenure of office of County Treasurers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter thirteen of the Revised Statutes
2 is hereby amended by striking out the word "two" in the
3 fourth line of said section and inserting in place thereof the
4 word 'four,' so that said section as amended, shall read as
5 follows:

'Sect. 3. Bond and tenure of office, Revised Statutes,
2 chapter 12, section 3. The person so elected and accepting
3 shall give bond to the county for the faithful discharge of
4 his duties in such sum as the commissioners order, and with

5 such sureties as they approve in writing thereon, and shall
6 hold his office for four years from the first day of the next
7 January, and until another is chosen and qualified in his
8 place.'
