STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to amend section eleven of chapter forty-one of the
Revised Statutes, relating to itinerant vendors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eleven of chapter forty-one of the Revised Statutes
2 is hereby amended by striking out the words "fifty" in the
3 fourth line of said section and inserting in place thereof
4 the words 'two hundred,' and also by striking out the word
5 "sixty" in the said fourth line of the section and inserting
6 in place thereof the word 'ninety,' so that said section as
7 amended shall read as follows: 'Every itinerant vendor
8 who shall sell or expose for sale, at public or private sale,
9 any goods, wares and merchandise without state and local

10 licenses therefor, issued as hereinafter provided, shall be
11 punished for each offense by fine not exceeding two hundred
12 dollars or by imprisonment not exceeding ninety days, or by
13 both such fine and imprisonment.'
