STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Six Hundred and Thirteen of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Ninety-three, as Amended by Chapter Three Hundred and Fourteen of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Ninety-five, Entitled "An Act to Establish the Western Hancock Municipal Court."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty of chapter six hundred and thirteen of the

private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninetythree as amended by chapter three hundred and fourteen of
the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and nine-

5 ty-five is hereby further amended so that said section as 6 amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 20. From and after July first, nineteen hundred 2 nineteen, the judge of said court shall receive as compen-3 sation an annual salary of seven hundred and fifty dollars, 4 to be paid monthly from the treasury of the county of Han-5 cock together with actual expenses incurred by him in the 6 trial of criminal cases in any town other than that in which 7 said judge may reside; and in addition thereto said judge 8 shall receive for every blank writ signed by him, five cents; 9 for entry of each civil action, sixty cents; taxing costs and 10 recording judgment, twenty-five cents; writ of execution or 11 possession, fifteen cents. The judge shall receive for every 12 warrant issued by him, one dollar, which together with all 13 costs and fines received by him in criminal cases shall, with-14 in sixty days after receipt thereof be by him paid to the 15 treasury of the county of Hancock.'
