STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, to Amend Section Thirty-eight of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen to Increase the Compensation of the Judge of Probate of Aroostook County.

Resolved, That section thirty-eight of chapter one hun-2 dred seventeen of the revised statutes is hereby amended 3 by striking out, in the sixth line thereof, the word "twelve" 4 and substituting therefor the word 'eighteen,' so that said 5 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 38. Compensation of judges of probate. 1915, c. 2 273. Judges of probate in the several counties shall receive 3 annual salaries from the treasuries of the counties in quar-

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4 terly payments on the first days of January, April, July and

5 October as follows:

Androscoggin, one thousand dollars. Aroostook, eighteen hundred dollars. Cumberland, three thousand dollars. Franklin, six hundred dollars. Hancock, eleven hundred dollars. Kennebec, seventeen hundred dollars. Knox, seven hundred dollars. Lincoln, five hundred dollars. Oxford, one thousand dollars. Penobscot, eighteen hundred dollars. Piscataquis, six hundred dollars. Sagadahoc, eight hundred dollars. Somerset, eight hundred dollars. Waldo, seven hundred dollars.

York, thirteen hundred dollars; and the fees to which they 2 are entitled by law, except the fee provided in section forty-3 nine of chapter one hundred and forty-five, shall be taxed 4 and collected and paid over by the registers of probate to 5 the county treasurers for the use of their counties.'

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
