STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT amending section nine of chapter nineteen of the Revised Statutes, relating to Public Health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section nine of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby

- 2 amended by striking out in the third and fourth lines thereof
- 3 the words "Secretary of the State Board of Health" and
- 4 inserting therefor the words 'local board of health,' so that
- 5 the said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 9. Tuberculosis is hereby declared to be an in-

- 2 fectious and communicable disease, dangerous to the public
- 3 health. Every physician in the state shall report in writing,

4 to the local board of health within forty-eight hours after the 5 fact comes to the knowledge of said physician, the name, 6 age, sex, color, occupation, place where last employed, if 7 known, and address, of every person known by said physi-8 cian to have tuberculosis. Such report shall be made on 9 forms furnished by the state board of health. The name 10 of the householder where the tuberculosis person lives or II boards, and such other facts as may be called for on the 12 blank reports so furnished shall also be included in the re-13 port. The chief officer having charge for the time being 14 of any hospital, dispensary, asylum, sanatorium or other 15 similar private or public institution in the state shall report 16 to the state board of health in like manner the name, age, 17 sex, color, occupation, place where last employed, if known, 18 and previous address of every patient having tuberculosis 19 who comes into his care or under his observation, within 20 forty-eight hours thereafter. Such physician or chief officer 21 shall also give notice to the secretary of the state board of 22 health of the change of address of any tuberculous patient 23 who is, or has lately been under his care if he is able to 24 give such information.'
