AN ACT to amend section three of chapter 130 of the revised  
statutes relating to the sale of milk.

---

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter one hundred thirty of the revised  
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words: "or  
3 as pure milk, milk from which the cream, or a part thereof  
4 has been removed" in the seventh and eighth lines thereof,  
5 so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Whoever by himself, clerk, servant or agent, sells, ex-  
2 changes or delivers, or has in his custody or possession  
3 with intent to sell, exchange or deliver, or exposes or of-  
4 fers for sale or exchange milk which is not of good standard

5 quality, adulterated milk or milk to which water or any  
6 foreign substance has been added, or milk produced from  
7 sick or diseased cows, or milk in or from cans or other  
8 utensils that are not in a clean or sanitary condition; and  
9 whoever by himself, clerk, servant or agent, sells, exchanges  
10 or delivers, or has in his custody with intent to sell, ex-  
11 change or deliver, cream containing less than eighteen per  
12 cent of milk fat, shall for the first offense be punished by a  
13 fine not exceeding fifty dollars, for a second offense by a  
14 fine of not less than fifty, nor more than one hundred dol-  
15 lars and for a subsequent offense by a fine of one hundred  
16 dollars and by imprisonment for not less than thirty, nor  
17 more than sixty days. And in prosecutions hereunder milk,  
18 which upon analysis is shown to contain less than eleven  
19 and seventy-five hundredths per cent of milk solids or less  
20 than three and twenty-five hundredths per cent of fat shall  
21 not be considered milk of good standard quality. Nothing  
22 in this section shall be construed to prohibit the sale of  
23 skimmed milk as such.'
