STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to amend section thirty-five, chapter thirty-seven, re-
vised Statutes, relating to unclean milk and unclean cream
containers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

To amend section 35, chapter 37, revised statutes of 1916
2 by striking out all of said section and inserting in its place
3 the following:

‘Penalty for placing any foul substance into any can, jug,
2 etc. Whoever shall, by himself, or by his servant, or agent,
3 or as a servant or agent of any other person, firm, or cor-
4 poration, send, ship, return or deliver, or cause, or permit
5 to be sent, shipped, returned, or delivered to any producer

6 of, or dealer in milk and cream, any can, jar, bottle, meas-
7 ure, or other vessel used as a container for milk and cream,
8 containing any offal, swill, kerosene, vegetable matter, rot-
9 ten or putrid milk, or any other offensive material shall be
10 punished for the first offense by a fine of not less than one
11 dollar nor more than five dollars for each can, jug, bottle
12 or jar so defiled; and for any subsequent offense by a fine
13 of not less than two dollars nor more than twenty dollars
14 for each can, jug, bottle or jar so defiled.'
