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STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

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AN ACT relating to sale of standing wood and timber on  
islands within the limits of the Indian Reservation of the  
Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No member of Penobscot Tribe of Indians  
2 shall hereafter be permitted to sell any standing wood or  
3 timber growing on any islands or lands in the Penobscot  
4 River within the limits of the Indian Reservation except to  
5 members of the tribe for firewood only; nor shall any mem-  
6 ber of said tribe lease any portion of his lands or islands  
7 within the limits of said reservation for the purpose of per-  
8 mitting any standing wood or timber to be cut and removed  
9 therefrom.

Sect. 2. The agent of said tribe of Indians is hereby forbidden to approve any lease of lands or islands within said reservation for the purpose of cutting or removing any standing wood or timber therefrom, or sale of any standing wood or timber, by any member of said tribe except as provided in section one of this act.
