RESOLVE, in Favor of George A. Phillips.

Resolved, That there be appropriated and paid to George

- 2 A. Phillips, petitioner for a seat in the house of representa-
- 3 tives of the seventy-ninth legislature, from the town of Bar
- 4 Harbor, to reimburse him for expense incurred and cash
- 5 paid out to establish his claim to such seat, the sum of
- 6 seventy-nine dollars and forty cents.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Subsequent to the election of representatives in nineteen hundred eighteen, one Herbert L. Graham of Bar Harbor was declared to be representative from said town to the seventy-ninth legislature. Petition was lodged with the legislature by George A. Phillips, contesting this seat; after hearing the evidence presented, George A. Phillips of Bar Harbor was declared duly elected member from said town.

Mr. Phillips incurred the following expense in the prosecution of his claim to the seat: counsel and legal services, twenty-five dollars; railroad fare from Bar Harbor to Augusta and return, four trips at eight dollars and sixty cents per trip, thirty-four dollars and forty cents; expense at Augusta, five dollars per trip, twenty dollars; total, seventy-nine dollars and forty cents.
