#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Fifty-four of Chapter Eighty-two of the Revised Statutes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 54 of chapter 82 of the revised statutes is hereby

- 2 amended by inserting after the word "necessity" in the
- 3 fifth line of said section, the words 'upon order of the chief
- 4 justice, or the justice appointed to hold said court, to a
- 5 fixed day, or'; and by inserting after the word "adjourned,"
- 6 in the sixth line thereof, the words 'without day'; so that
- 7 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 54. When no justice attends on the day for holding 2 a court, the sheriff, or in his absence, the clerk, shall by

3 oral proclamation in the court-house and by notice posted 4 on the door thereof, adjourn the court from day to day 5 until a justice attends, and, in case of necessity, upon order 6 of the chief justice, or the justice appointed to hold said 7 court, to a fixed day, or without day; and when so ad-8 journed without day, actions brought for that term shall be 9 entered by the clerk, and they, with all actions on the dock-10 et, shall be continued to the next term.'
