STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Sixty-four of Chapter Thirty-three of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seventeen, Relating to the Use of Automobiles in Hunting Wild Birds and Wild Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 64 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as amend2 ed by chapter 219 of the public laws of 1917, is hereby
3 amended by striking out all of said section and by sub4 stituting therefor the following section:

'Sect. 64. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, 2 chase, catch, kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal

3 at any time from an automobile, or by aid or use of any 4 light or lights carried thereon, or attached thereto. It shall 5 also be unlawful for any person to have in possession, at 6 any time, any wild bird or wild animal, or part thereof, 7 taken in violation of any provision of this section. Who-8 ever violates any provision of this section shall pay a fine o of not less than forty dollars nor more than one hundred 10 dollars and costs for each offense, and in addition thereto II shall forfeit to the state any automobile or light so used 12 unlawfully as aforesaid, and in case of conviction for vio-13 lation of this section the court shall declare the same for-14 feited, to be sold for the benefit of the state. The posses-15 sion by any person of any loaded firearm or a firearm with 16 a cartridge, or cartridges, in the magazine thereof, in an 17 automobile at any time shall be prima facie evidence of 18 hunting in violation of this section.'
