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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

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RESOLVE in Favor of William F. Livingston.

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Resolved: That there be paid to William F. Livingston of  
2 Hallowell, in the county of Kennebec, and State of Maine,  
3 the sum of four hundred dollars per year, payable in equal  
4 monthly installments, beginning January first, nineteen  
5 hundred and nineteen, and continuing during the pleasure  
6 of the Legislature and until otherwise ordered.



## STATEMENT OF FACTS

William F. Livingston entered the employ of the state as assistant librarian in the Maine State Library in January, nineteen hundred and three, and continued in that capacity until December first, nineteen hundred and eighteen. Mr. Livingston was stricken with paralysis in October, nineteen hundred and seventeen and is now unable to perform either manual or mental labor.

During Mr. Livingston's term of service he received annually a salary of twelve hundred dollars. This amount was never increased because Mr. Livingston gave part of his time to St. Mathews Church in Hallowell, of which church he was rector. Because of this part time service he is now unable to obtain the usual pension from the church. A grant of three hundred dollars annually from special funds has been made to him. This special grant of three hundred dollars, together with his personal income is not sufficient for his needs.
