STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to amend chapter four hundred and twenty-four of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seven as amended by chapter forty-eight of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, changing the time of the annual meeting of Kittery Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L. 1907, c. 424, amended. Chapter 424 of the 2 private and special laws of 1917 as amended by chapter 48 3 of the private and special laws of 1917 is further amended 4 by striking out "July" in the twelfth line and substituting 5 therefor the word 'January,' so that said section as amended 6 will read as follows:

'Sect. 5. Annual election of officers to be held in January 2 instead of July. All the affairs of said water district shall

3 be managed by a board of trustees composed of three mem-4 bers, to be chosen by ballot by the legal voters within said 5 water district, the first election to be at the meeting of the 6 legal voters of the said corporation to be called to accept this 7 act, one to serve until the annual meeting to be held in nine-8 teen hundred and eight, one to serve until the annual meeting 9 to be held in nineteen hundred and nine, and one to serve 10 until the annual meeting in nineteen hundred and ten. When-II ever the term of office of a trustee shall expire the legal 12 voters of the said water district shall elect a successor to 13 serve for a full term of three years, and if any other 14 vacancy occurs it may be filled in like manner for the unex-15 pired term. The annual election of officers shall be in the 16 month of January. As soon as convenient after the board 17 of trustees has been chosen, the said trustees shall hold a 18 meeting at the office of the selectmen in the town of Kittery, 19 and organize by the election of a chairman and clerk, adopt 20 a corporate seal, and when necessary, may choose a treasurer 21 and all other needful officers and agents for the proper 22 management of the affairs of said water district. 23 tees may procure an office and incur such expenses as may 24 be necessary. Each member shall receive in full compensa-25 tion for his services an allowance of fifty dollars per year 26 or such other less sum as the said water district at any 27 legal meeting may prescribe. The said water disrict at any 28 legal meeting thereof, called for the purpose, may adopt such 29 by-laws and provisions, not inconsistent with the laws and 30 constitution of this state and the United States, as they may
31 deem expedient and necessary for the better government and
32 regulation of the municipal affairs within said water dis33 trict, in which case such by-laws and provisions so adopted,
34 shall extend to said water district as fully, to all intents and
35 purposes, as the other provisions of this act, subject only to
36 alterations or additions by a two-thirds vote, at a legal meet37 ing of the water district called for the purpose.'
