STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT Relating to Martin's Point Bridge, So-called, in the
County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The County Commissioners of Cumberland
2 County are hereby authorized to cause surveys and bor-
3 ings to be made at the site of Martin's Point Bridge, so-
4 called, and preliminary plans and specifications to be pre-
5 pared, for the reconstruction of said bridge by such engi-
6 neer or engineers as they may see fit to employ; such plans
7 to be designed to show, as far as practicable, the relative
8 costs and advantages of pile, steel, and concrete structures.

Sect. 2. For the purpose of making and maintaining said
2 Martin's Point Bridge safe and convenient for travel pend-

3 ing the determination of the proper type of bridge to be
4 adopted to replace the present structure, the said County
5 Commissioners are hereby authorized to repair or replace
6 such portions of Martin's Point Bridge as may in their
7 judgment be necessary with material of the same general
8 character as the present bridge.

Sect. 3. For accomplishing the purposes of this act, said
2 County of Cumberland through its commissioners is au-
3 thorized to borrow money temporarily and to issue there-
4 for the negotiable notes of the County of Cumberland,
5 and for the purpose of refunding the indebtedness so cre-
6 ated and of paying any necessary expenses incurred under
7 the provisions of this act, the said County of Cumberland
8 may from time to time issue its bonds to an amount not
9 exceeding \$60,000. Said obligations shall be valid without
10 first obtaining the consent of the county as provided in sec-
11 tions 18 and 20 of chapter 83 of the revised statutes.
