STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, Making Appropriations for the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians for the Years Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen and Nineteen Hundred and Twenty.

Resolved: WHEREAS, the State of Maine holds in trust for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, to wit: Ninety-nine thousand eight hundred five dollars and sixteen cents, and whereas all funds appropriated by the Seventy-eighth Legislature for the care, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law, and because of the lack of available funds, said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing;

WHEREAS, by reason of the foregoing facts the appro-

priation called for in this resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and in the opinion of this legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated in the constitution, be it therefore

Resolved: That there be paid from the state treasury, 2 to be expended under the direction of the governor and 3 council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of In-4 dians for the benefit of said tribe for the years nineteen hun-5 dred nineteen and nineteen hundred twenty, as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This resolve carries the regular appropriation for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, together with such special appropriations as are deemed necessary for their comfort and support, during the years nineteen hundred and nineteen and nineteen hundred and twenty.
