#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

McQuillan and Pooler, contractors, of Skowhegan, Maine, were requested to furnish materials for use in the construction of the Women's Reformatory at Skowhegan.

Before furnishing any of the necessary material, as requested by the firm of Wilbur and Son, of Bangor, McQuillan and Pooler interviewed Mr. Clyde H. Smith, of Skowhegan, who was chairman of the building committee of the Women's Reformatory Building, with reference to the matter, especially as to the terms and conditions of payment. McQuillan and Pooler were informed by Mr. Smith to proceed in furnishing the necessary material as ordered, and that the State of Maine would see to it that payment was made. McQuillan and Pooler accordingly furnished the material as so requested, according to the itemized statement hereto attached.

The above mentioned Wilbur and Son went into bank-ruptcy.

McQuillan and Pooler furnished this material with the distinct understanding on the part of the chairman of the building committee that the State of Maine would be responsible for its payment.

The funds authorized to be used in this instance were applied to another account where said Wilbur and Son were operating on a similar contract for the State of Maine.
