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RESOLVE, in Favor of The Blunt Hardware Co. for Material Furnished by Them in the Construction of the Women's Reformatory at Skowhegan.

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Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated in  
2 favor of The Blunt Hardware Co., the sum of two hun-  
3 dred forty-four dollars and fifty-eight cents in payment of  
4 their bill for that amount for materials furnished by them  
5 in the construction of the Women's Reformatory at Skow-  
6 hegan.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Blunt Hardware Co. is a copartnership having a store and place of business in Skowhegan. They are requested to furnish materials for use in the construction of the Women's Reformatory at Skowhegan and interviewed Mr. Clyde H. Smith, a resident of Skowhegan, and who was chairman of the building committee of the Women's Reformatory building. Blunt Hardware Co., before furnishing any of the necessary material as requested by the firm of Wilbur & Co. of Bangor, interviewed Mr. Clyde H. Smith, chairman, with reference to the matter, especially as to terms and conditions of payment. The Blunt Hardware Co. was informed by Mr. Smith to proceed in furnishing the necessary material as ordered and that the State of Maine would see to it that payment was made. The Blunt Hardware Co. accordingly furnished the material as so requested according to the itemized statement herewith attached.

The above mentioned Wilbur & Son went into bankruptcy.

The Blunt Hardware Co. furnished this material with the distinct understanding on the part of the chairman of the Building Commission that the State of Maine would be responsible for its payment.

The funds authorized to be used in this instance were applied to another account where said Wilbur & Son were operating on a similar contract for the State of Maine.
