STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter Two Hundred and Seventy-two of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, Entitled An Act to Require Certain Vehicles to Carry Lights at Night and to Control the Glare of Head Lights.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section one of chapter two hundred and seventy-two of
2 the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, is hereby
3 amended by striking out after the word "freight" in the
4 eighth line of said section one, the words "nor shall it apply
5 to any form of vehicle whatsoever while upon any bridge or
6 highway where street lights are maintained at a distance of

7 five hundred feet apart or less," so that said section one as 8 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 1. Every vehicle on wheels, whether stationary or 2 in motion, on any public way or bridge, shall have attached 3 to it a light or lights so displayed as to be visible from the 4 front and the rear thereof during the period from one hour 5 after sunset to one hour before sunrise; provided, however, 6 that this act shall not apply to any vehicle which is designed 7 to be propelled by hand, or any vehicle designed for the 8 transportation of hay, straw, wood, lumber, stone, machinery 9 or other heavy freight.'

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
