STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT Relating to Sale of Standing Wood and Timber on
Islands Within the Limits of the Indian Reservation of the
Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No member of Penobscot tribe of Indians shall hereafter
2 be permitted to sell any standing wood or timber growing
3 on any islands or lands in the Penobscot river within the
4 limits of the Indian reservation except to members of the
5 tribe for firewood only; nor shall any member of said tribe
6 lease any portion of his lands or islands within the limits
7 of said reservation for the purpose of permitting any stand-
8 ing wood or timber to be cut and removed therefrom ex-
9 cept with the consent and approval of the Indian agent.
