STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Mrs. Alfred
Polk of Lewiston.

Resolved: That there be paid to Mrs. Alfred Polk of
2 Lewiston, the county of Androscoggin and state of Maine,
3 the sum of eight dollars (\$8) per month payable quarterly
4 from the fund appropriated for military pensions, begin-
5 ning January first, nineteen hundred and nineteen and con-
6 tinuing during the pleasure of the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Polk is the daughter of a civil war veteran, William B. Foss, who enlisted at Rockland, Maine, in the 4th Maine Infantry, and who was killed at the Battle of Bull Run. She finds herself unfortunately at this time in necessitous circumstances. She has no one upon whom she can rely for support except a minor son who is in ill health. Mrs. Polk is a woman of about sixty years of age and is unable to work because of sickness and her husband deceased some six or seven years ago.
