RESOLVE, in favor of the Maine School for the Feeble-minded for Maintenance for the Years Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen and Nineteen Hundred Twenty.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for

For personal services, namely, for salaries and wages of all officers and employees except those wholly engaged in repairs of buildings and equipment, for the year nineteen hundred nineteen, the sum of thirty-

Provided, that any balance of the sums above appropriated
 2 for the year nineteen hundred nineteen which may remain
 3 unexpended at the end of the year shall be available for
 4 expenditures during the year nineteen hundred twenty, and
 5 provided further, that the governor and council may, by
 6 order, upon recommendation of the trustees of said institu-
 7 tion, authorize the use of unexpended balances of any of
 8 the above appropriations to meet deficiencies in other appro-
 9 priations for the same institution.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The estimates for maintenance for the year 1919 and the year 1920, are based on the gross per capita cost for the year 1918, plus an increase of 103 inmates over the daily average of 1918. (The new dormitory for boys, now under construction and nearly completed, will accommodate 105 inmates.)
