STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Regulate the Taking of Smelts and Tom Cods in the Waters of Whitten Parritt Stream, Tunk Stream and All Waters Tributary to Steuben Bay and Joys Bay, Above Lobster Island Narrows in the Town of Steuben, in Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. It shall be unlawful to fish for or take any
2 tom cods or smelts, except by hook and line or gaff, be3 tween the first day of October and the first day of May, in
4 the following waters in Washington county:

In all the waters of Whitten Parritt Stream, in town of 2 Gouldsboro, Hancock county; in the waters of Tunk Stream 3 and in all the waters tributary to, or which empty into

4 Steuben Bay and Joys Bay, above the Lobster Island Nar5 rows, so-called, at Rogers Point in the town of Steuben,
6 in Washington county.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of section one 2 of this act shall upon conviction be punished by a fine of 3 not less than twenty dollars nor more than fifty dollars 4 for each offense.
