STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to amend Sections thirty-five and thirty-eight of Chapter forty-five of the Revised Statutes determining the measurement of Lobsters and establishing a maximum and minimum length.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. That all of the first sentence of section thirty-2 five of chapter forty-five, being all of said section to the 3 words "the possession" in the tenth line thereof be stricken 4 out that there be inserted in place of the sentence stricken 5 out the following: 'No person shall buy or sell, give away 6 or expose for sale or possess for any purpose any lobster 7 less than three and one-eighth inches in length or more than

8 four and three-quarters inches in length, alive or dead, 9 cooked or uncooked, measured in manner as follows: Tak-10 ing the length of the back of the lobster measured from the 11 eye socket to the nearest point of the rear of the body shell. 12 Any lobster shorter or longer than the prescribed length 13 when caught shall be immediately liberated alive at the risk 14 and cost of the persons taking it under penalty of five dol-15 lars for each lobster so caught, bought, sold, given away or 16 exposed for sale, or in possession,' so that said section as 17 amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. No person shall buy or sell, give away or 2 expose for sale or possess for any purpose any lobster less 3 than three and one-eighth inches in length or more than four 4 and three-quarters inches in length alive or dead, cooked or 5 uncooked, measured in manner as follows: Taking the 6 length of the back of the lobster measured from the eye 7 socket to the nearest point of the rear end of the body shell. 8 Any lobster shorter or longer than the prescribed length 9 when caught shall be immediately liberated alive at the risk 10 and cost of the person taking it under a penalty of five 11 dollars for each lobster so caught, bought, sold, given 12 away, or exposed for sale, or in possession. The possession 13 of mutilated lobsters, cooked or uncooked shall be prima 14 facie evidence that they are not of the required length. 15 All lobsters or parts of lobsters sold for use in this state or 16 for export therefrom must be sold and delivered in the shell, 17 under a penalty of twenty dollars for each offense; and

18 whoever ships, transports, carries, buys, gives away, sells 19 or exposes for sale lobster meat after the same shall have 20 been taken from the shell shall be liable to a penalty of one 21 dollar for each pound of meat so shipped, transported, car-22 ried, bought, given away, sold, or exposed for sale. Any 23 person or corporation in the business of a common carrier 24 of merchandise, who shall knowingly carry or transport 25 from place to place lobster meat after the same shall have 26 been taken from the shell shall be liable to a penalty of fifty 27 dollars upon conviction thereof. All lobster meat so illeg-28 ally shipped, transported, carried, bought, given away, sold, 29 or exposed for sale shall be liable to seizure and may be 30 confiscated. Nothing contained herein shall be held to pro-31 hibit the sale of lobsters that have been legally canned.

Sect. 2. Section thirty-eight of chapter forty-five is 2 hereby amended by striking out the words "four and three-3 quarters inches" in the second and third line and inserting 4 in place thereof the words 'three and one-eighth inches or 5 more than four and three quarters inches' and said section 6 is further amended by striking out the word "one" in the 7 fifth line and inserting in place thereof the word 'five,' so 8 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. No person shall can lobsters less than three and 2 one-eighth inches or more than four and three quarters 3 inches in length, alive or dead, measured in accordance with 4 section thirty-five; and for every lobster canned contrary 5 to the provisions of this section, every person, firm, asso-

6 ciation or corporation so canning shall be liable to a pen-7 alty of five dollars for every lobster so canned, and a 8 further penalty of three hundred dollars for every day on 9 which such unlawful canning is carried on.'
