STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Prohibit the Use of Trawls of More than Four Thousand Hooks, or More than Ten Nets, within the Following Waters:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. The use of more than four thousand hooks of

2 trawl or more than ten nets by the crew of any dory, boat

3 or vessel in one day within the following line is hereby

4 prohibited:

Sect. 2. Inside of a direct line drawn from Little River 2 Head to Cummings Head, Great Wass Island; from Cum-3 mings Head to Scoodic Point; and from Scoodic Point 4 to east head of Isle au Haut; from east head of Isle au Haut

- 5 to Pemaquid Point; and from Pemaquid Point to Cape 6 Elizabeth.
- Sect. 3. Any person violating any provision of this act 2 shall be punished by a fine of not less than three hundred 3 dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each of-4 fense.
