STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Forty of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, Increasing the Salary of the Clerk of Courts for the County of Lincoln.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. C. 117, Sec. 40, relating to compensation of clerks of courts amended. Section forty of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "one thousand" in the fourteenth line of said section and inserting in place thereof the words 'twelve hundred' and adding after the word "them" in the thirty-seventh line the following: 'and the clerk in Lincoln county in full for all such services and in full for ser-

9 vices as clerk of Lincoln municipal court,' so that said sec-
10 tion as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 40. Compensation of clerks of courts. 1915, c. 148,
2 c. 335, 1917, c. 167. The clerks of the judicial courts in
3 the several counties shall receive annual salaries from the
4 treasuries of the counties in monthly payments on the last
5 day of each month as follows:

Androscoggin, two thousand dollars.

Aroostook, two thousand dollars and expenses, 1917, c. 279.

Cumberland, two thousand five hundred dollars; deputy
2 clerk of courts, eighteen hundred dollars.

Franklin, twelve hundred dollars.

Hancock, two thousand one hundred dollars; beginning
2 with the first day of January, nineteen hundred and nine-
3 teen, eighteen hundred dollars.

• Kennebec, two thousand three hundred and fifty dollars.

Knox, thirteen hundred dollars.

Lincoln, twelve hundred dollars.

Oxford, sixteen hundred dollars.

Penobscot, twenty-two hundred dollars.

Piscataquis, twelve hundred dollars.

Sagadahoc, seventeen hundred dollars.

Somerset, eighteen hundred dollars.

Waldo, twelve hundred dollars.

Washington, fifteen hundred dollars; beginning with the
2 first day of January, nineteen hundred and seventeen, four-
3 teen hundred and fifty dollars.

York, nineteen hundred dollars.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation
2 for the performance of all duties required of clerks, in-
3 cluding those performed by them as clerks of the supreme
4 judicial court, superior and county commissioners' courts,
5 or by clerks pro tempore, employed by them, and the clerk
6 in Lincoln county in full for all such services and in full
7 for services as clerk of Lincoln municipal court. They
8 shall account quarterly under oath to the county treasurers
9 for all fees received by them or payable to them by virtue
10 of the office, except fees collected by them in naturaliza-
11 tion proceedings under the act of Congress of June twenty-
12 fifth, nineteen hundred ten, specifying the items, and shall
13 pay the whole amount of the same to the treasurers of their
14 respective counties quarterly on the first days of January,
15 April, July and October of each year.'
