## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-five of Chapter One Hundred and Twenty-six of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Observance of Sunday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-five of chapter one hundred twenty-six of

the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the
word "ten" in the last line thereof and inserting in place
thereof the words 'one hundred', and by adding after the
word "dollars" in the last line thereof the following: 'Municipal courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction under this section.' So that said section as amended shall

'Sec. 35. Whoever, on the Lord's Day, keeps open his 2 shop, workhouse, warehouse or place of business, travels, 3 or does any work, labor or business on that day, except 4 works of necessity or charity; uses any sport, game or 5 recreation; or is present at any dancing, public diversion, 6 show or entertainment, encouraging the same, shall be 7 punished by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars. Mu-8 nicipal courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction unged this section.'
