STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-five of Chapter One Hundred and Twenty-six of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Observance of Sunday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-five of chapter one hundred twenty-six of
2 the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the
3 word "ten" in the last line thereof and inserting in place
4 thereof the words 'one hundred', and by adding after the
5 word "dollars" in the last line thereof the following: 'Municipal courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction under this section.' So that said section as amended shall

8 read as follows:

'Sec. 35. Whoever, on the Lord's Day, keeps open his
2 shop, workhouse, warehouse or place of business, travels,
3 or does any work, labor or business on that day, except
4 works of necessity or charity; uses any sport, game or
5 recreation; or is present at any dancing, public diversion,
6 show or entertainment, encouraging the same, shall be
7 punished by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars. Mu-
8 nicipal courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction un-
9 der this section.'
