## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to incorporate the York Beach Chamber of Commerce.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The York Beach Chamber of Commerce, a 2 voluntary association existing at York Beach in York in 3 the County of York, for the promotion of the industry, com-4 merce, and public interest of said York Beach, is hereby 5 constituted and declared to be a body politic and corpor-6 ate, under the name of the York Beach Chamber of Com-7 merce, with the same rights, objects, powers, privileges, im-8 munities and duties specifically set forth in its written arti-9 cles of voluntary association and organization, and with

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10 the same by-laws, and with the privileges of amendment 11 thereof or the adoption of new by-laws, and with all the 12 rights, and privileges, powers and immunities of corpora-13 tions organized under the first six sections of chapter sixty-14 two of the Revised Statutes of Maine.
