STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to amend section one hundred four of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes relating to the reports of academies and private schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred four of chapter sixteen of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out after the word
3 "state" in the third line thereof the words "under the six
4 preceding sections, shall annually, on or before the first day
5 of January," and substituting therefor the words 'and of
6 every academy or private school approved for attendance
7 or tuition purposes, shall annually, on or before the first day
8 of August,' so that said section when amended shall read
9 as follows:

‘Sect. 104. Every educational institution receiving state
2 aid, and the officers and teachers of every academy receiv-
3 ing money from the state, and of every academy or pri-
4 vate school approved for attendance or tuition purposes,
5 shall annually, on or before the first day of August, report
6 to the state superintendent of public schools the total and
7 average attendance, an itemized account of all the moneys
8 received and expended during the preceding year, the num-
9 ber of instructors, number and length of terms, with at-
10 tendance for each, and answer such other questions as he
11 shall require, and shall make such further report to him as
12 he may from time to time require. Such reports shall be
13 published in the annual report of the state superintendent
14 of public schools. Every such educational institution fail-
15 ing to comply with the above requirements shall forfeit
16 whatever aid or assistance it would otherwise receive from
17 the state. Wherever in sections ninety-eight to one hundred
18 and four, inclusive, the word “academy” occurs, it shall be
19 construed to include “seminary or institute.”’
