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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

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RESOLVE, to Provide Funds for Vocational Education.

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Resolved: That the state of Maine may cooperate with  
2 the federal government in the extension of instruction in  
3 home economics, agriculture and in the trades and indus-  
4 tries in all-day schools, part-time and evening classes for  
5 persons over fourteen years of age who are to enter prac-  
6 tical work in these occupations and for the purpose of  
7 increasing the efficiency and facilitating advancement, earn-  
8 ing capacity and promotion of those already engaged in  
9 said occupations there is hereby appropriated out of the  
10 general funds of the state the sum of fifteen thousand dol-  
11 lars for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen and twenty

12 thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and twenty,  
13 and annually thereafter. Such funds shall be used under  
14 the direction of the state board for vocational education  
15 for instruction, equipment, supervision and for the payment  
16 of the actual necessary expenses of the board in carrying  
17 out the provisions of the plans and specifications set up  
18 by the state board and approved by the federal board for  
19 vocational education.
