STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT for the Better Protection of Alewives in the Waters of This State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. No person shall at any time take any alewives

- 2 in any river, brook or stream which is one hundred feet
- 3 or less in width. No person shall at any time take any
- 4 alewives with a dipnet in any waters of this state, except
- 5 that dipnets may be used for taking alewives out of weirs
- 6 in tidal waters.
 - Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
- 2 be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred nor
- 3 more than two hundred dollars for each offense.
- Sect. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this 2 act are hereby repealed.
