#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT additional to Chapter forty-five of the Revised Statutes, relating to the sea and shore fisheries, and prohibiting the transportation of lobsters beyond the limits of the State, except by common carrier, until a permit for said purpose is issued by the commission of sea and shore fisheries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The commission of sea and shore fisheries

shall maintain at Kittery, Maine, an office for the issuance

of permits to remove lobsters taken within the limits of the

state to points beyond the limits of the state of Maine and

no person, firm or corporation shall transport or remove

beyond the limits of the state, any such lobsters until said

- 7 lobsters are presented at said office for examination and 8 until upon application therefor filed at said office, said com9 missioners shall grant a permit for the removal of said to lobsters beyond the limits of the state; except that common carriers engaged in carrying freight on fixed schedules may without said permit transport beyond the state, lobsters legally caught, provided that lobsers are received by said to common carriers at one of their regular established places of business upon land for receiving freight.
- Sect. 2. The commission of sea and shore fisheries shall 2 upon application therefor filed as provided in section one of 3 this act grant a permit to remove beyond the limits of the 4 state such lobsters as they shall determine to be of lawful 5 length and otherwise lawfully entitled to be held and transformed.
- Sect. 3. Whoever violates section one of this act shall 2 upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment for not less 3 than sixty nor more than ninety days and all vessels, boats, 4 smacks, automobile or other conveyances used to transport 5 or remove lobsters beyond the limits of the state in violation 6 of the provisions of this act shall be liable to be forfeited to 7 the state and proceedings for said forfeiture may be had 8 according to the provisions of chapter one hundred and 9 three of the revised statutes.
