### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Appropriate Moneys for the Expenditures of the Government and for Other Purposes for the Year Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen.

WHEREAS, the appropriation of moneys for the maintenance of the several branches of the state government, its institutions and for other purposes, is an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. In order to provide for the several acts and 2 resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of moneys

3 from the state treasury, and also to provide in part for the 4 necessary expenditures of government and for other pur5 poses, for the current fiscal year nineteen hundred nine6 teen, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of 7 any moneys in the state treasury, and except where other8 wise specially provided, the governor with the advice of 9 the council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the 10 first day of July, nineteen hundred twenty, to draw his 11 warrant on the state treasurer for the same.
