STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Forty-one of Chapter Thirty-six of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Analysis of Feeding Stuffs, Commercial Fertilizers, etc.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section forty-one of chapter thirty-six of the revised stat2 utes is hereby amended by striking out in the first, second
3 and third lines of said section the following words: "The
4 sum of nine thousand dollars shall be annually appropriated
5 in favor of the commissioner of agriculture," and by in6 serting in place thereof the words, "The legislature shall
7 from time to time appropriate sums in favor of the com-

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8 missioner of agriculture, division of inspections'; also by 9 striking out in the seventh line of said section the word 10 "quarterly"; so that as amended said section shall read as 11 follows:

'Sect. 41. Appropriation. 1909, c. 115, section 1. 1913, 2 c. 140, section 1. The legislature shall from time to time 3 appropriate sums in favor of the commissioner of agri-4 culture, division of inspections, and the same shall be ex-5 pended by the commissioner in executing the laws relating 6 to the collection, examination, inspection and analysis of 7 agricultural seeds, concentrated commercial feeding stuffs, 8 commercial fertilizer, and foods and drugs. Payments of 9 said appropriation shall be made upon the warrants of the 10 governor and council. The commissioner shall annually 11 publish a classified account of all receipts and expenditures 12 under this section.'
