STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Increase the Salary of the Judge of the Bath Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter 104, section 1 of the public laws of 1899, as
2 amended by chapter 158 of the public laws of 1901 is here-
3 by amended by striking out between the word "of" in the
4 tenth line of said section and the word "dollars" in the
5 eleventh line of said section the words "one thousand" and
6 inserting in place thereof the words 'fifteen hundred,' so
7 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. A municipal court is hereby established in
2 and for the city of Bath and the towns of Woolwich, Ar-

3 rowsic, Georgetown, Phippsburg and West Bath in the
4 county of Sagadahoc, which shall be called the Bath Mu-
5 nicipal court and have and use a seal on all original pro-
6 cesses, and shall consist of one judge, who shall be ap-
7 pointed, commissioned and qualified as provided by the law
8 and constitution of the state. Said judge shall be a mem-
9 ber of the bar of Sagadahoc county and shall reside dur-
10 ing his continuance in office in the city of Bath, and who
11 shall receive from said city an annual salary of fifteen
12 hundred dollars per year, to be paid him in quarterly pay-
13 ments. Said salary shall be in full for all the fees and emol-
14 uments of the office; provided, however, that he shall re-
15 ceive in addition to said salary the legal fees for all copies
16 of processes and certificates by him made. The present
17 judge shall continue in office until the end of the term for
18 which he was appointed. The said judge shall enter, or
19 cause to be entered on the docket of said court, all civil
20 and criminal actions, with full minutes of the proceedings
21 in and disposition of the same, which docket shall be at all
22 times open to inspection, and he shall perform all other
23 duties required of similar tribunals in this state.'
