Resolved: That the sum of one hundred and seventy-

- 2 five thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby, appro-
- 3 proiated to provide for the following improvements and
- 4 additions to the state prison at Thomaston, the same to
- 5 be expended by the board of prison commissioners subject
- 6 to the approval of the governor and council:

Purchase of two farms \$15,000 00

Construction of engine and boiler house 15,000 00

Construction of building to contain dining-room, kitchen, hospital, dis-

pensary, chaplain's office, school-	
room, bath-room, store-house and	
blacksmith shop	80,000 00
Equipment for above building	5,000 00
Remodelling of cell-house	59,000 00
Equipment of old wing	1,000 00

\$175,000 00

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The foregoing resolve specifically states the purposes for which this request is made. This necessary state institution seems to have been rather neglected in the past and its present condition demands a considerable amount of new construction and equipment to put it into that condition of efficiency that its importance warrants.
