STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Authorize the Director of Sea and Shore Fisheries
to Employ Necessary Clerks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-five of chapter one hundred seventeen of
2 the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred
3 ninety-three of the public laws of nineteen hundred seven-
4 teen, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "two
5 thousand dollars" in the third line of said section the words
6 'he may employ necessary clerks in conducting the work
7 of his office and'; so that as amended said section shall
8 read as follows:

'Sect. 25. The department of sea and shore fisheries. 1909,
2 c. 204. 1915, c. 124. The director of sea and shore fish-
3 eries shall receive an annual salary of two thousand dol-
4 lars; he may employ necessary clerks in conducting the
5 work of his office and he shall also receive his actual travel-
6 ing expenses incurred in the performance of his official du-
7 ties.

Fish wardens shall receive two dollars and fifty cents a
2 day and their expenses when actually employed.'
