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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

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RESOLVE, in Favor of the Bank Commissioner for the Administration and Enforcement of Sections Eleven to Twenty-three Inclusive of Chapter Forty of the Revised Statutes.

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Resolved: That the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for  
2 the year nineteen hundred nineteen and the sum of fifteen  
3 hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred twenty be,  
4 and hereby is, appropriated to be used under the direction  
5 of the bank commissioner for the administration and en-  
6 forcement of sections eleven to twenty-three inclusive of  
7 chapter forty of the revised statutes.
