STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Provide for the Jurisdiction of the Public Utilities Commission over Certain Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. The public utilities commission shall have jur2 isdiction over every person, firm or corporation operating
3 any motor vehicle upon any public street or highway for
4 the carrying of passengers for hire and in such manner as
5 to afford a means of transportation similar to that offered
6 by street railways, and commonly known as a jitney or jit7 ney bus.

Sect. 2. Said commission is hereby authorized to make 2 from time to time rules and regulations governing the opera-

3 tion of said motor vehicles, which shall include provisions 4 concerning the route of operation, schedule to be operated 5 and maintained, rates of fare to be charged for the carriage 6 of passengers, the safeguarding of passengers and other per-7 sons using the streets and highways, filing of bond or in-8 surance policies to pay judgments recovered, due to negli-9 gence, and such other reasonable regulations as may be 10 deemed necessary for the safety or convenience of the 11 public.

Sect. 3. Nothing herein contained shall exempt any per-2 son, firm or corporation owning or operating said motor 3 vehicle or vehicles from complying with existing statutes 4 relating to the ownership, registration and operation of 5 motor vehicles in this state as defined in chapter 26 of the 6 revised statutes.

Sect. 4. No person, firm or corporation shall operate 2 such motor vehicle or vehicles on any street or highway 3 in any city or town of this state, without obtaining from 4 the public utilities commission, a certificate permitting such 5 operation. Any person, firm or corporation violating the 6 provisions of this section forfeits to the state one hundred 7 dollars for each offense, to be recovered in an action on 8 the case, or by complaint and indictment, and the attorney 9 general shall institute proceedings to recover same.

Sect. 5. Any person, firm or corporation operating such 2 motor vehicle or vehicles on any street or highway in any 3 city or town of this state, failing to comply with any rules

4 or regulations made by said public utilities commission shall
5 be subject to the penalties provided in sections 63 to 67 both
6 inclusive of chapter 55 of the revised statutes.
