## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that a joint special committee consisting of the speaker of the House, ex-officio, and three members on the part of the House to be named by the speaker, and the president of the Senate, ex-officio, and two members upon the part of the Senate to be named by the president of the Senate, be appointed to formulate a comprehensive plan for the codification and grouping of the various enactments creating and governing the state administrative and executive departments; and be it further

ORDERED, that it is the sense of this legislature that a re-organization and consolidation of the several state depart-

ments, commissions, boards and bureaus, is possible and desirable at this time; and be it further

ORDERED, that such committee shall proceed with diligence to inquire into the whole proposition and report from time to time to the present legislature for further instructions, suggestions or actions; and be it further

ORDERED, that such committee consider carefully the urgent need of a fixed policy insuring to all of the people of our state the largest possible measure of efficient service consistent with the absolute necessity of the most rigid and practical economy.
