STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Providing that all State and State Aid Roads and Highways Shall Be Constructed Only of Stone and Gravel.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. All roads and highways constructed from
2 money received in whole or in part from the State, regard3 less of its source, shall be of suitable stone foundation with
4 a surface of gravel, except that it shall be permissible to
5 use oil or tar products as a binder.

Sect. 2. This act shall not be construed to apply to repair 2 work on roads where the cost of such work does not exceed 3 two thousand dollars per mile.

Sect. 3. This act shall not apply to any contract made

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2 previous to the passage thereof, but any contract made in
3 violation thereof after the passage of this act shall be void.
Sect. 4. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are
2 hereby repealed.

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
